WHAT IS NCR-STAT?

The North Central Region Database (NCR-Stat) include primary economic and social household data collected at the state level.

■ The NCR-Stat Database focus on households, businesses, and community well-being in rural and urban communities in the North Central Region.







WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF NCR-STAT?

- Understand the conditions and issues facing rural and urban communities within the NCR.
- Provide regional and state-level data.
- Data are for researchers, Extension educators, practitioners, and decisionmakers.
- Leverage seed data for more in-depth studies.



THE GOALS OF NCR-STAT: BASELINE & CAREGIVING SURVEYS

Baseline Survey

- To get a better picture of the NCR and learn more about household demographics, income, workforce participation, entrepreneurship, caregiving, human capital, housing, broadband access, placemaking, community leadership, civic engagement, health and wellness, food security, and the environment.
- Starting point for following surveys on specific thematic areas.

Caregiving Survey

- Caregiving across the life course
- Who provides child, adult, and older adult care
- Individuals' lived experience with caregiving
- How caregiving affects economic development and quality of life in the NCR
- Develop recommendations to support caregiving and caregivers



Finished collection in March 2024

SURVEY METHODOLOGY

- 20-minute Qualtrics online small business survey in rural and urban areas in all 12 NCR states (102+ observations per state)
- Survey content:
 - Screeners (quota questions)
 - Owner Demographics
 - Business Characteristics
 - Copreneur Spouse
 - Small Business Benefits
 - Substance Misuse and Mental Health
 - Workforce Development

- Trust and Community
- Adjustment Strategies
- Socioemotional Wealth (SEW)
- Financial Information
- Household Characteristics
- Exit Strategies



QUOTAS & SCREENERS

Overall quotas and specifications:

- 1) Must own a small business in the North Central Region (12-state area)
 - Less than 500 employees, not including the owner [Source: Small Business Administration]
- 2) Share of urban and rural small business owners
 - Minimum 30% of rural business owners [Source: U.S. Census Bureau]
- 3) Share of small business owners by gender
 - Min 42% female respondents, min 45% male respondents



QUOTAS & SCREENERS

- Overall quotas and specifications (continued):
 - 4) By race and Hispanic origin of the business owner [Source: U.S. Census Bureau and Small Business Administration]
 - 1.2% American Indians and Alaska Natives
 - 0.3% Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander
 - 8% Asian
 - 12% Black
 - 79% White
 - 16% Hispanic
 - 5) Share of Veteran small business owners
 - 6% served in the U.S. Armed Forces, including the Coast Guard, the National Guard, or a Reserve component of any service branch



DATA COLLECTION - NCR-STAT: SMALL BUSINESS SURVEY

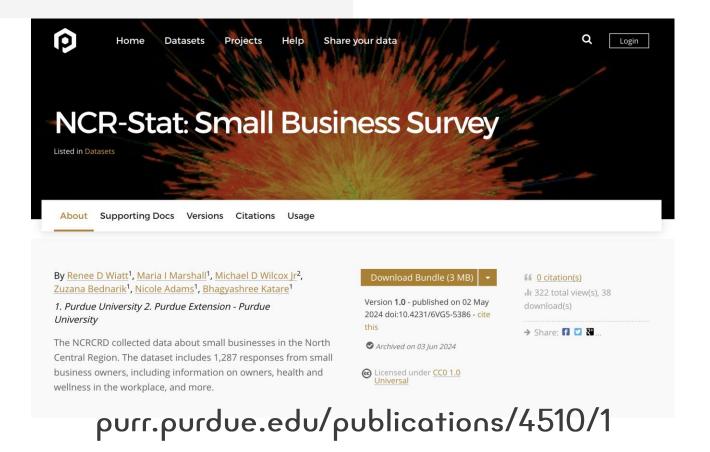
- The commercial company Qualtrics® employed a survey and gathered data based on predefined quotas and screening questions.
- The required number of respondents was 1,200 (100 per state).
- An **online survey** using Qualtrics (sample size: 1,287 small businesses; 102+ per state):

 Missouri
 Ohio
 - Indiana
 Michigan
 Nebraska
 South Dakota
 - Iowa
 Minnesota
 North Dakota
 Wisconsin
- The final number of respondents is 1,287:
 - Non-Employers: N=310 (24.09%)
 - 1-10 Employees: N=723 (56.18%)
 - 11-100 Employees: N=195 (15.15%)
 - 101-500 Employees: N=59 (4.58%)

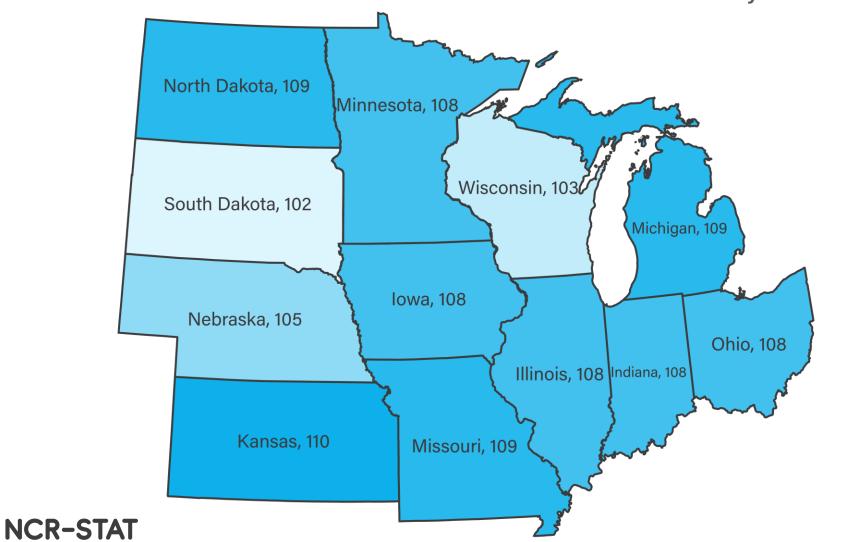




STATES IN THE NORTH CENTRAL REGION

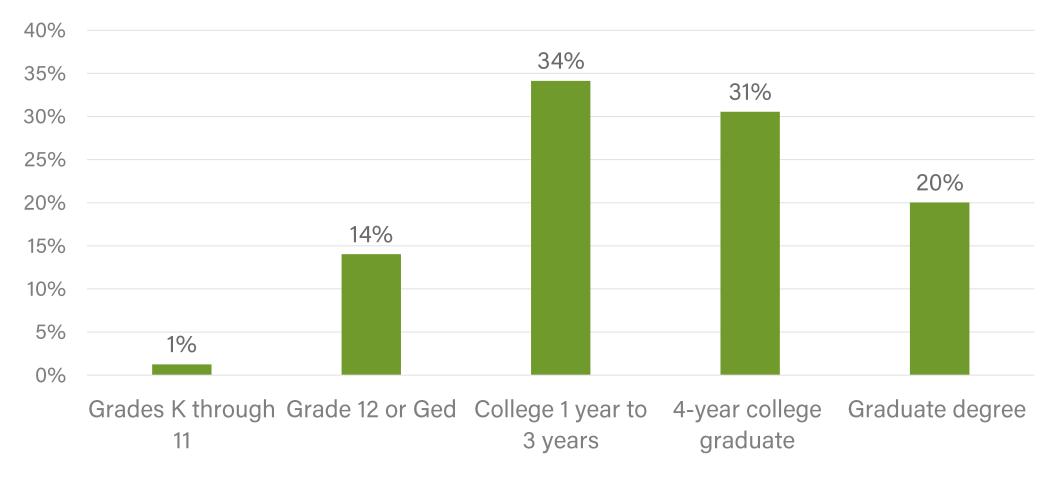

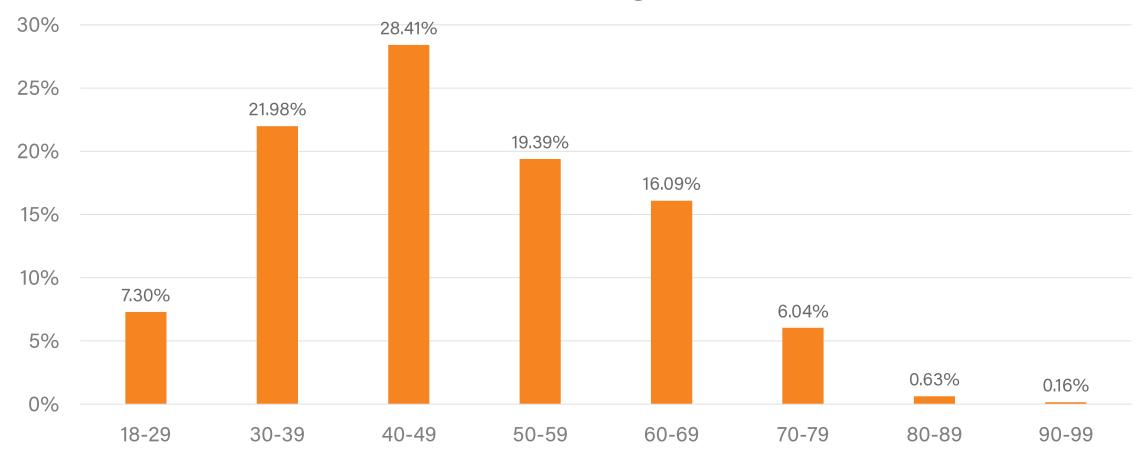
Small Business Owner Education Level

Business Owner Age in Years

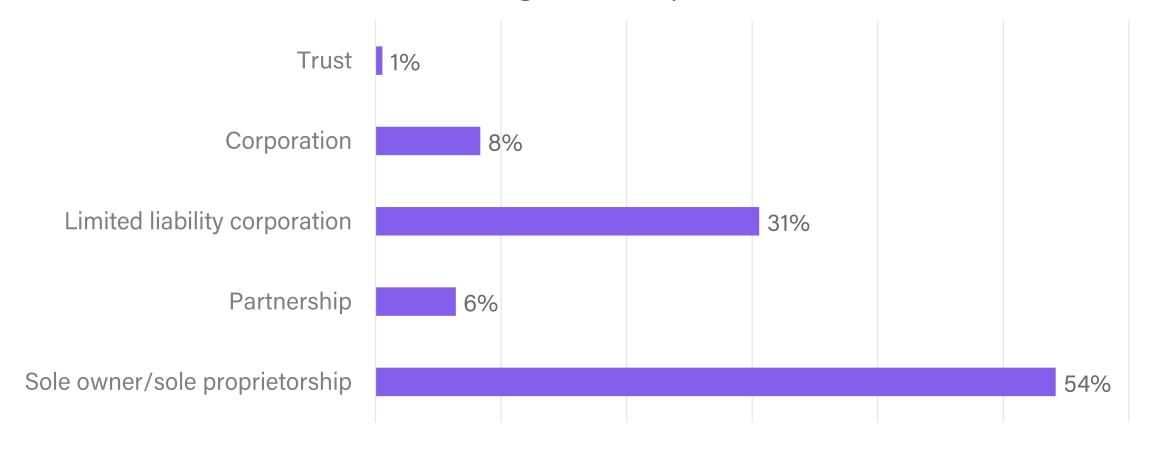

BUSINESS LEGAL CONFIGURATION

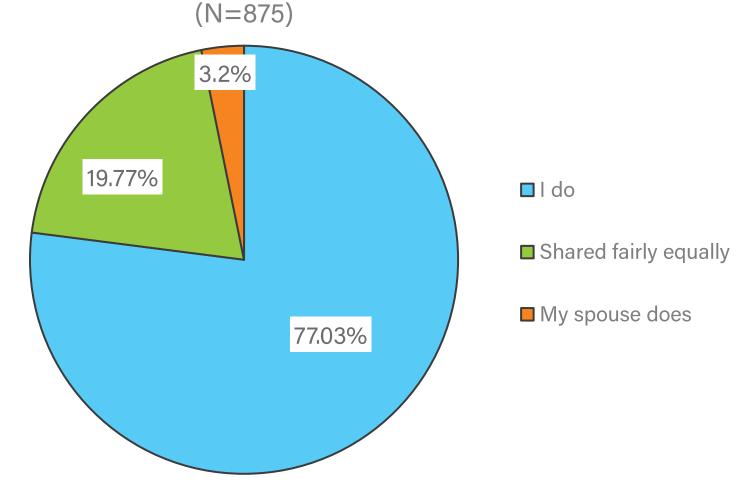
What is the configuration of your business?

Copreneurs: Who makes decisions on how profits are utilized?

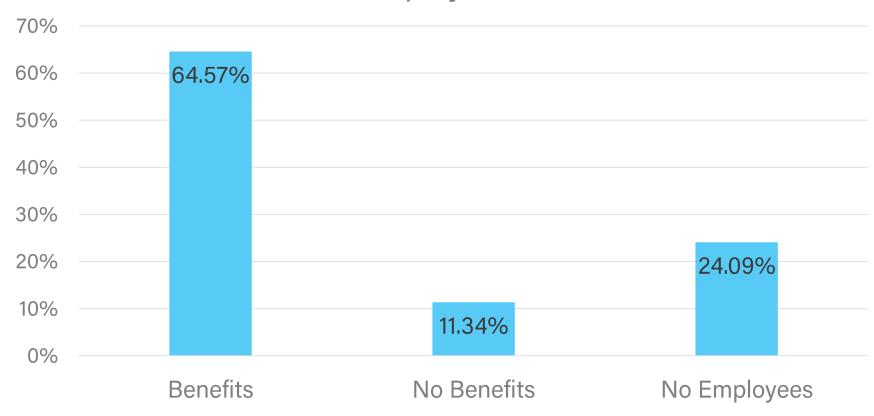

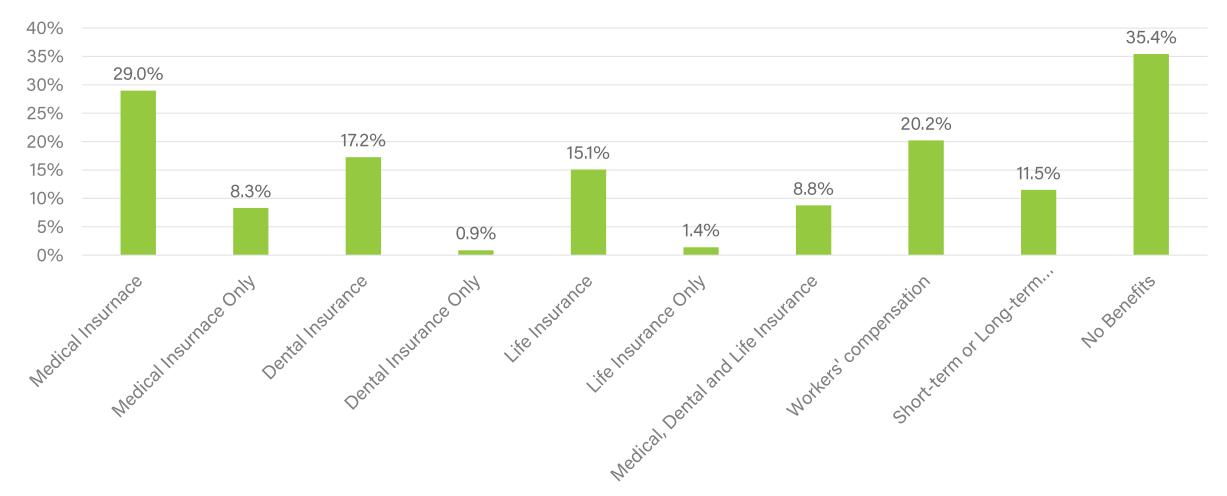
Does your business provide benefits to employees?

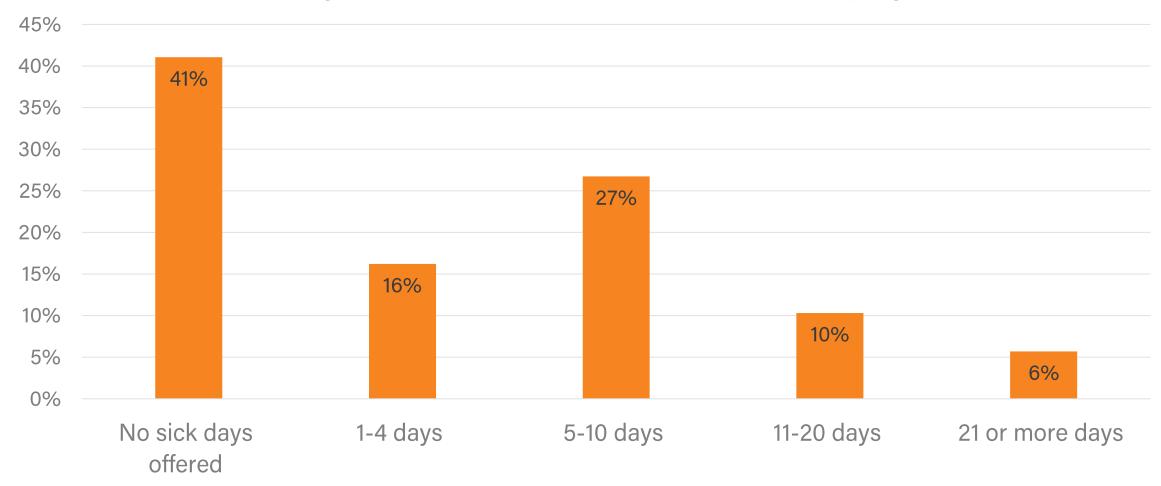
Small Business Benefits





SICK DAYS PER YEAR PROVIDED TO EMPLOYEES

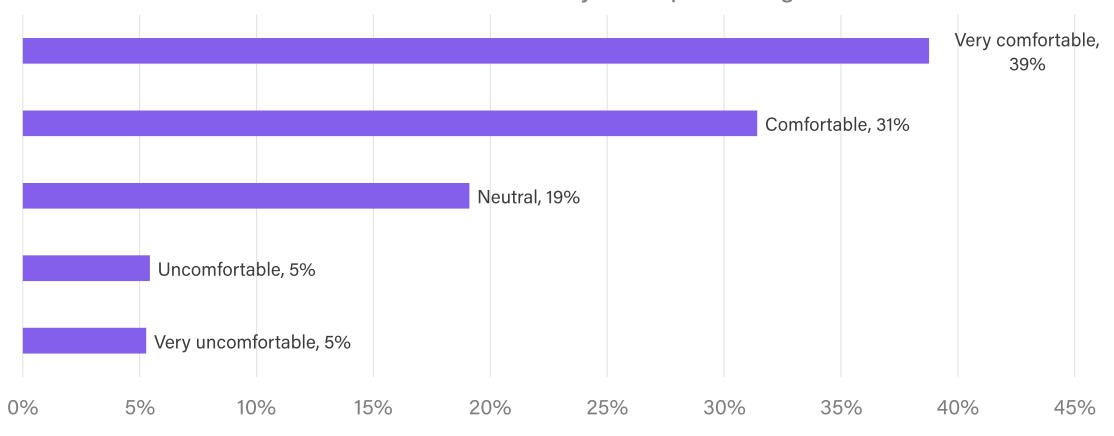
Sick Days per Year Provided for Full-Time Employees

How comfortable would you feel talking with your employee about a mental health issue that they are experiencing?

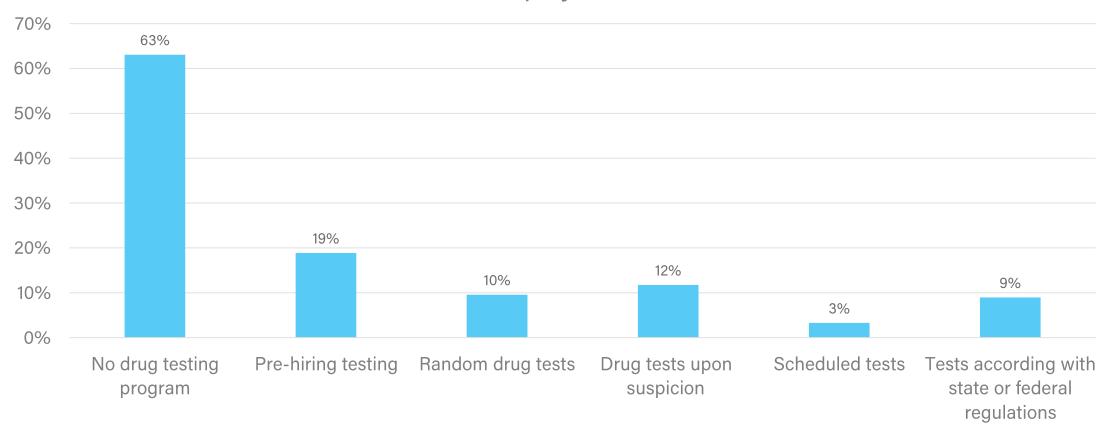

DRUG TESTING POLICIES IN SMALL BUSINESSES

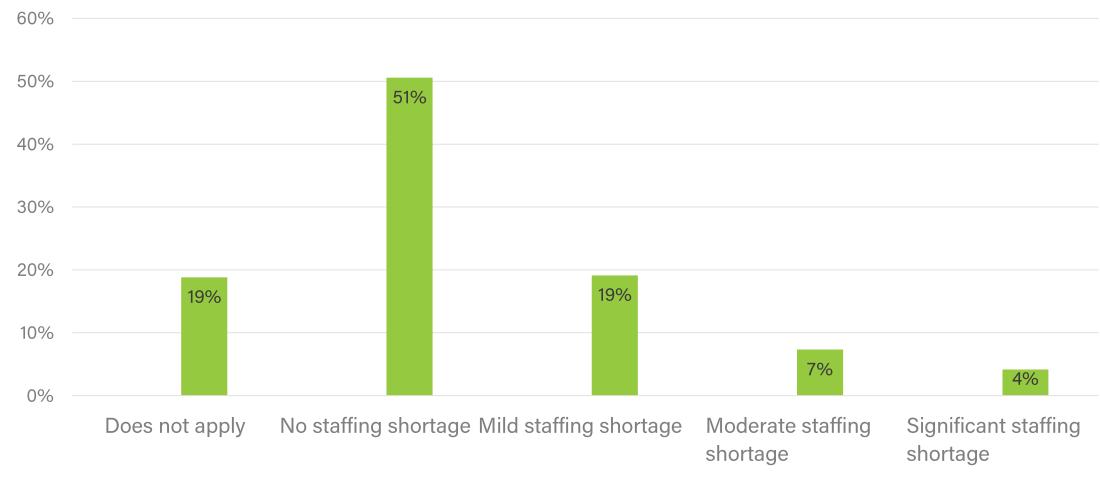
Which of the following best describes your drug testing program for employees?
