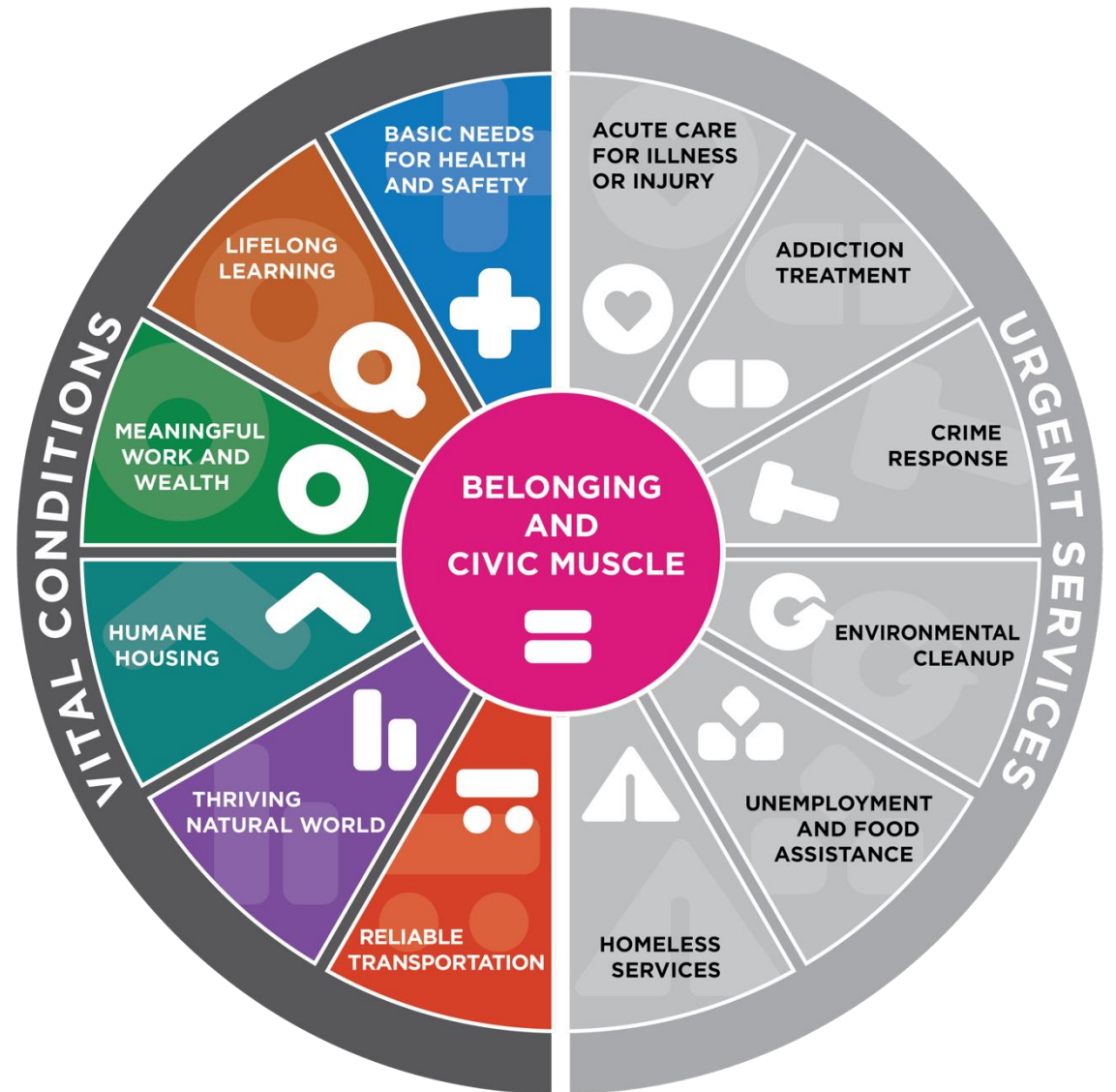

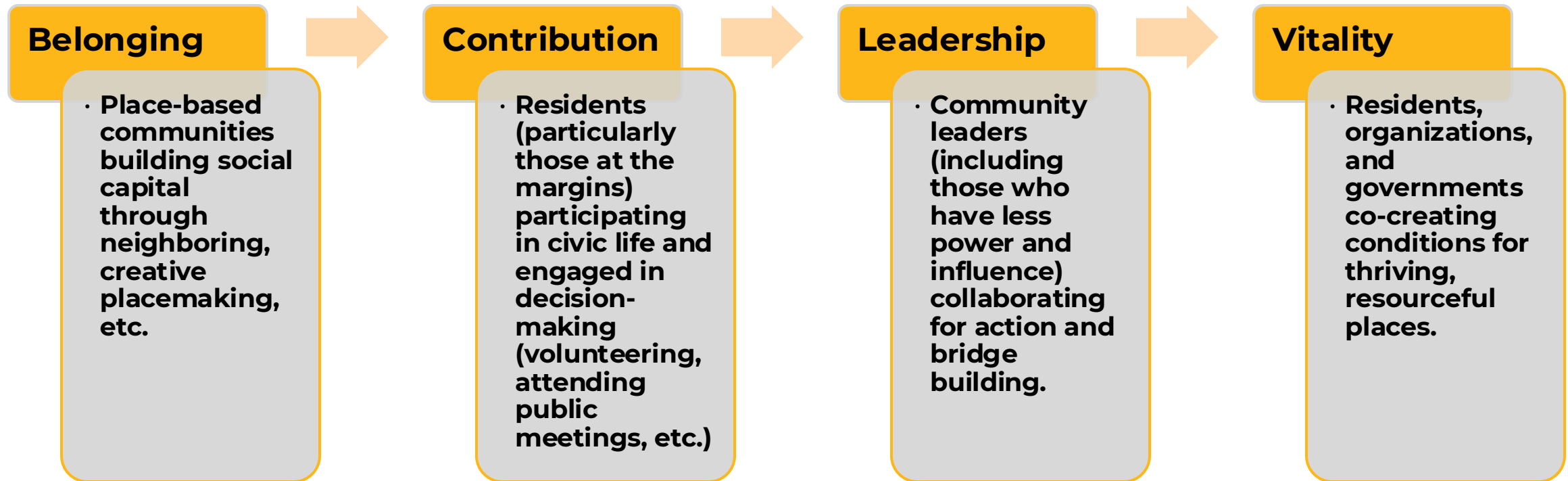
- Thriving Together Springboard – all people and places are thriving, no exceptions.

The Civic Muscle Index is a framework for exploring the characteristics that contribute to thriving communities and engaged citizenry.

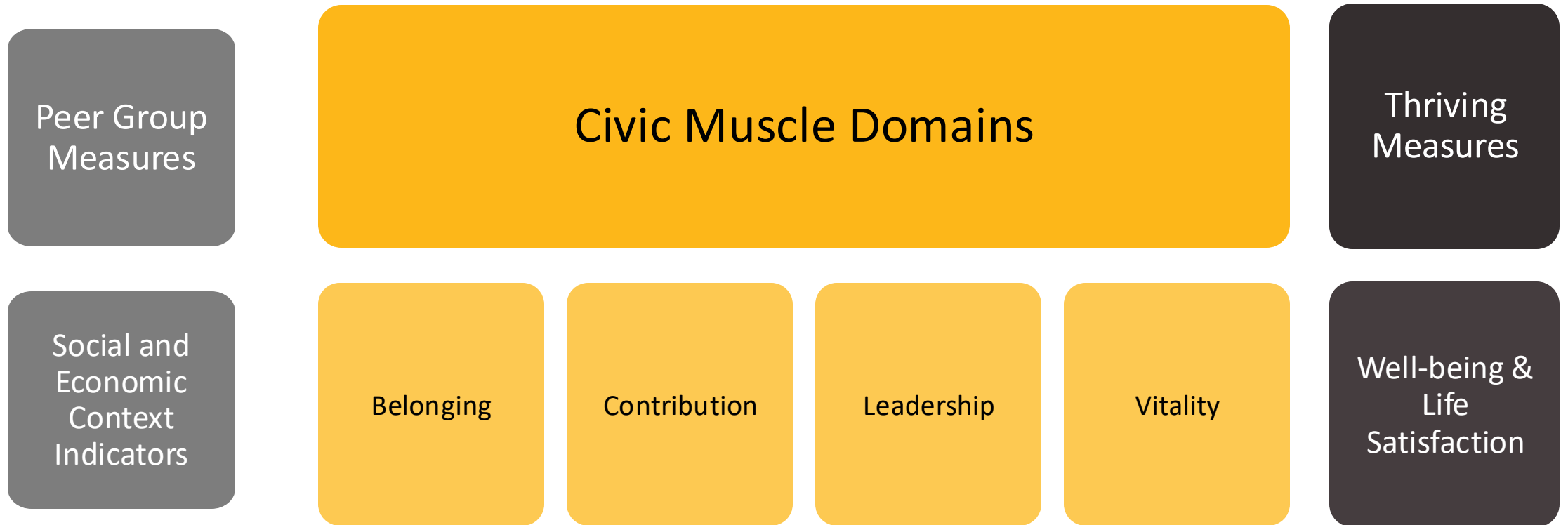

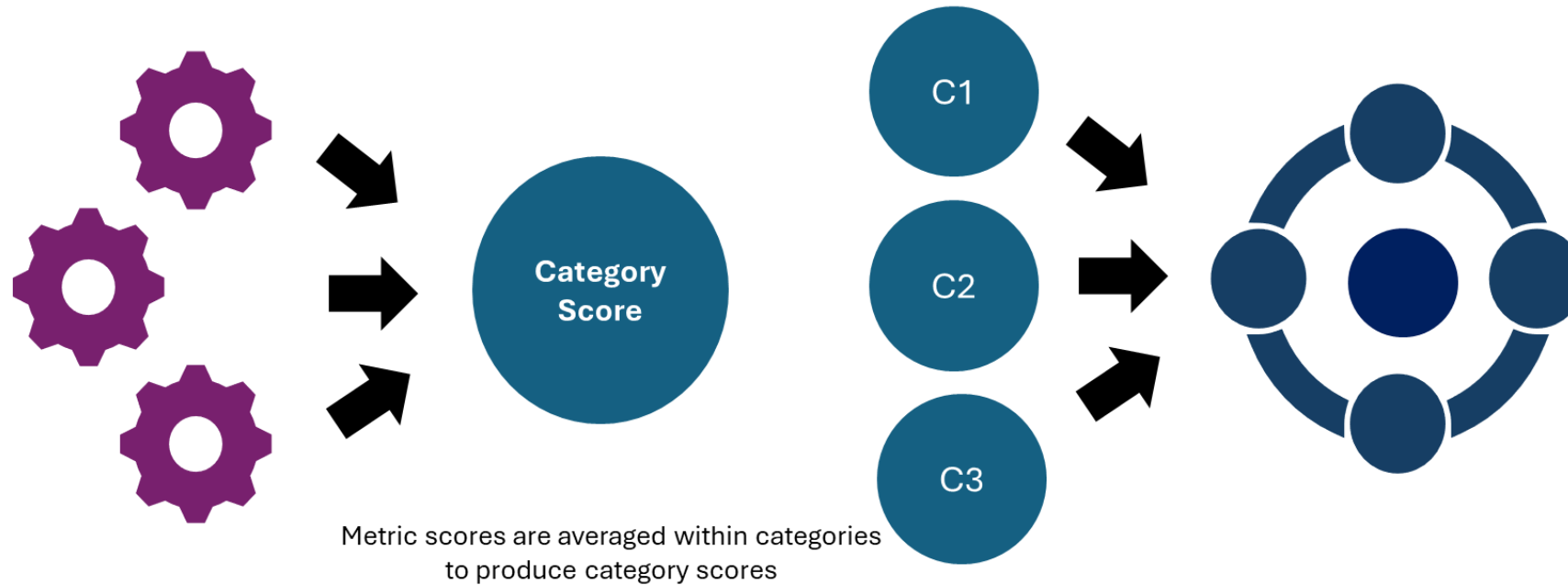
CIVIC MUSCLE INDEX DOMAINS



CIVIC MUSCLE INDEX METHODOLOGY

Data are gathered and scores are generated for each county-level metric on a 0-100 scale

Category scores are weighted and averaged to produce the final Civic Muscle Index score

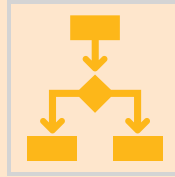

CIVIC MUSCLE INDEX RANKING



Hierarchical Model

Uses framework categories and subcategories

Aggregate subcomponents before final aggregation.



Weighting Considerations

Some metrics weighted (when conceptually similar)



Missing Data Handling

Impute missing data from peers, if available

Exclude from rankings when # of missing metrics exceeds threshold

PEER COUNTY COMPARISON

- **Peer Groups Analysis**

- Allows for meaningful comparison of counties based on shared characteristics

- **Mahalanobis Distance**

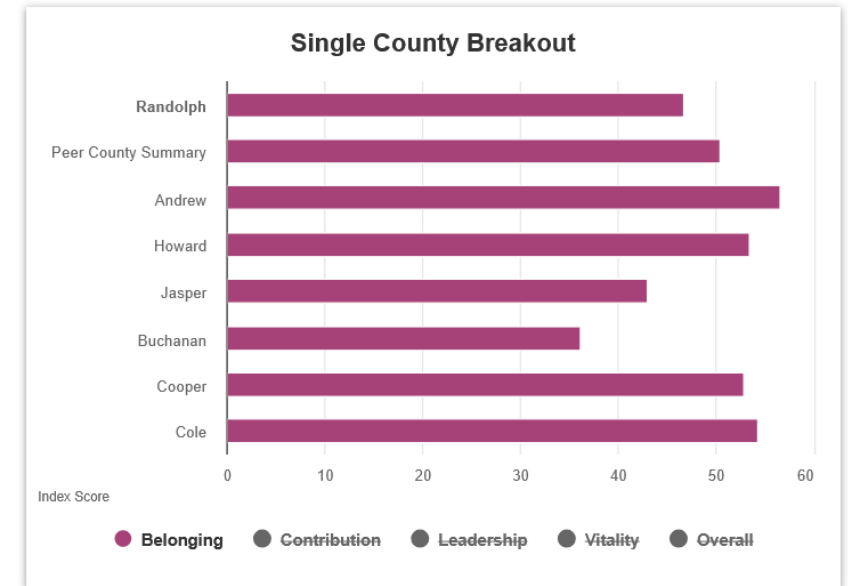
- Analytical method selected to generate peers

- **Independent from Civic Muscle**

- Defined using demographic and economic factors

- **Top 6 Peers** Identified

- Unique set for each county

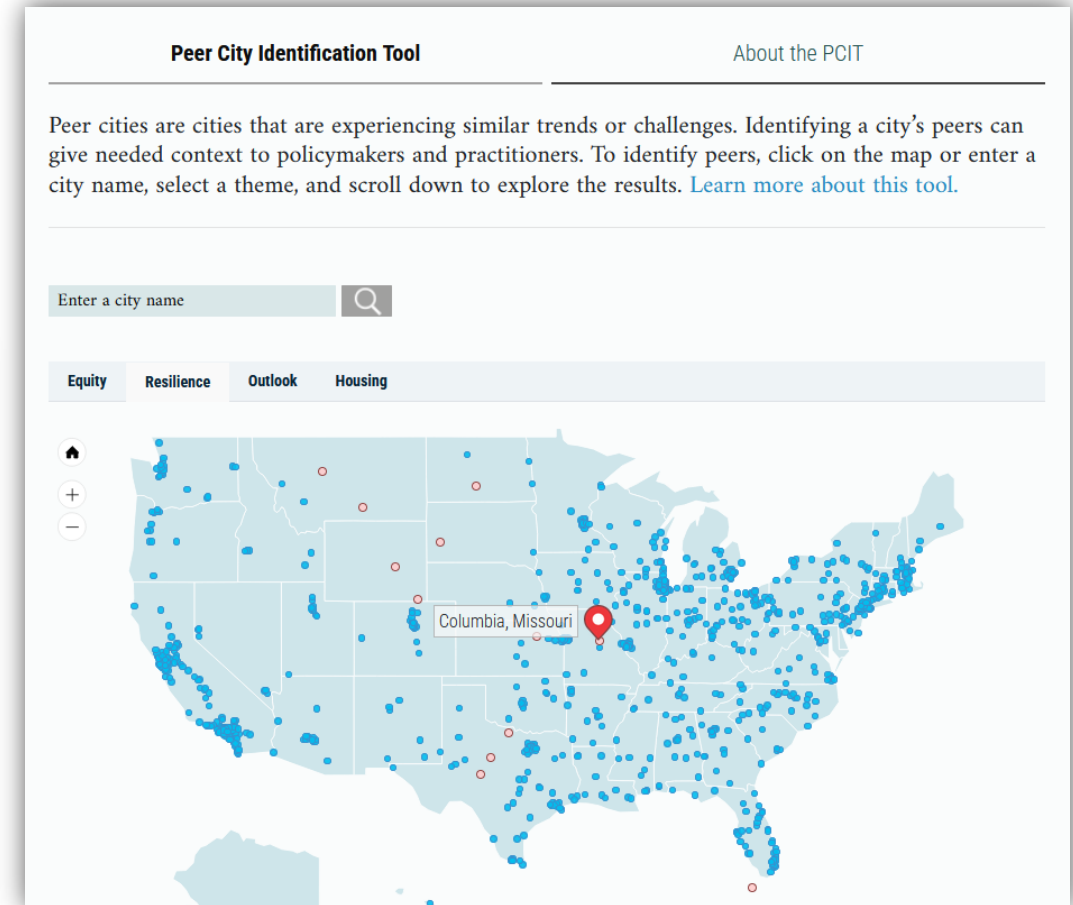
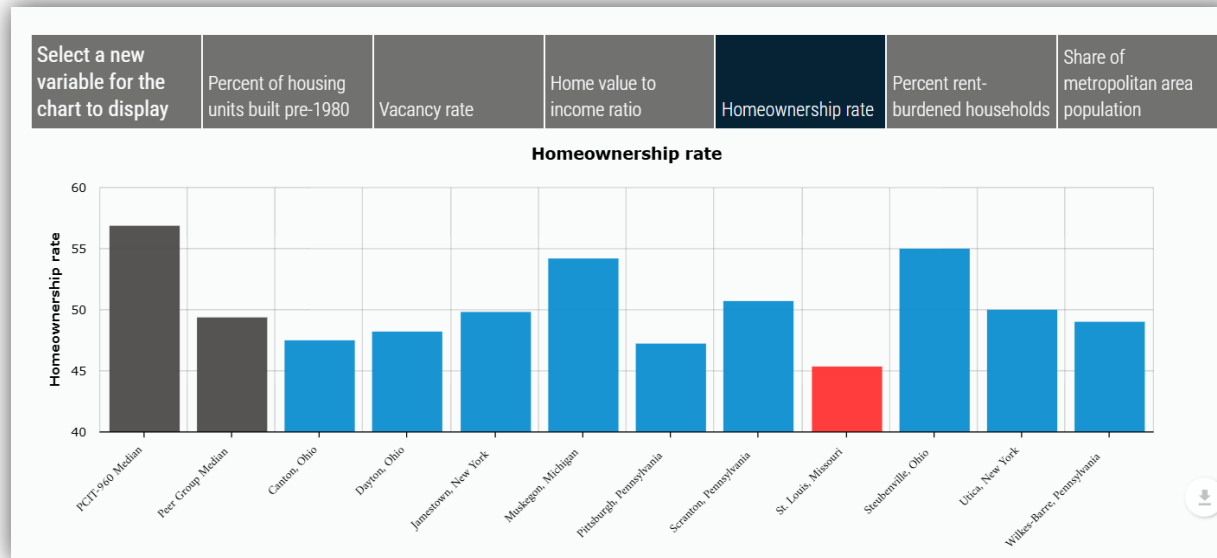

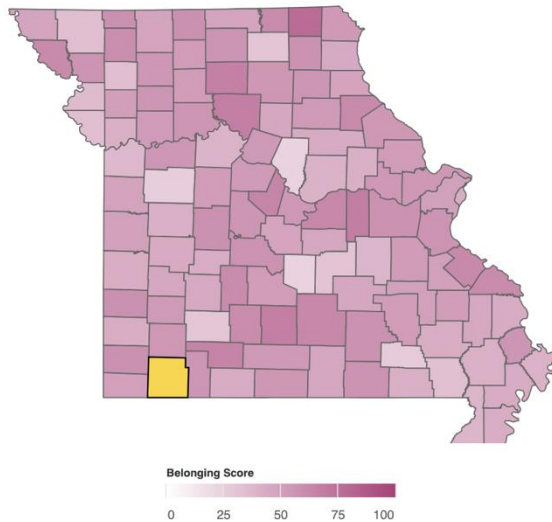

How Strong is Belonging in Your Community?

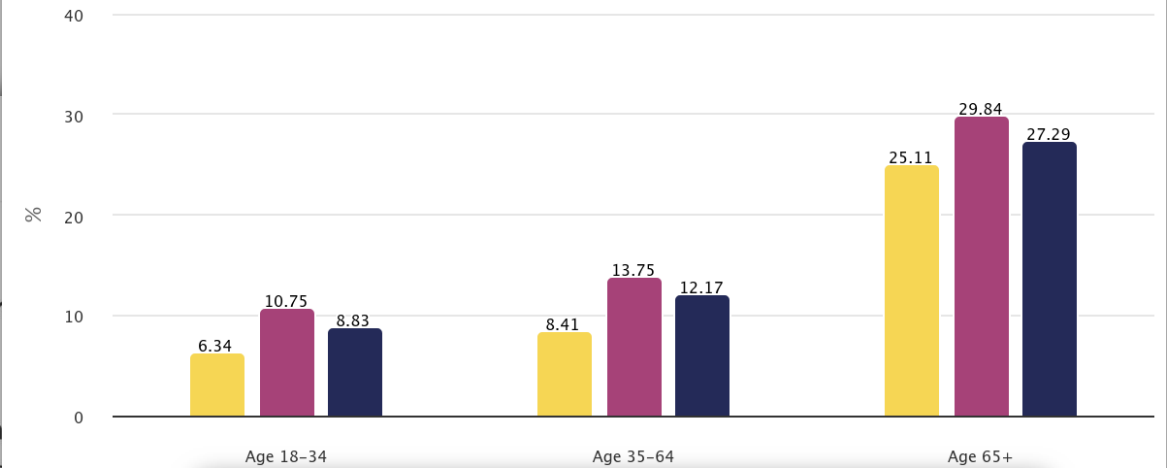

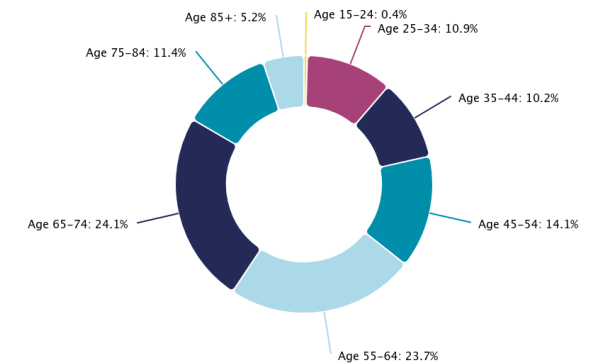
Belonging Score

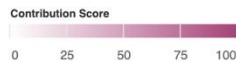
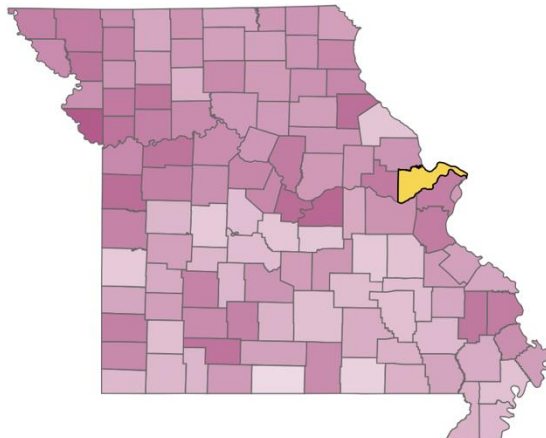

How Strong is Contribution Community?

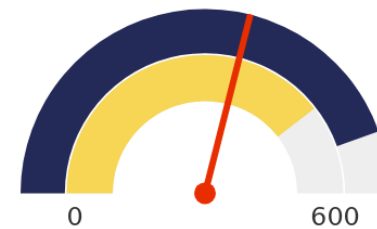

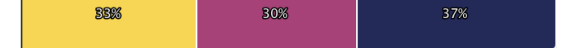

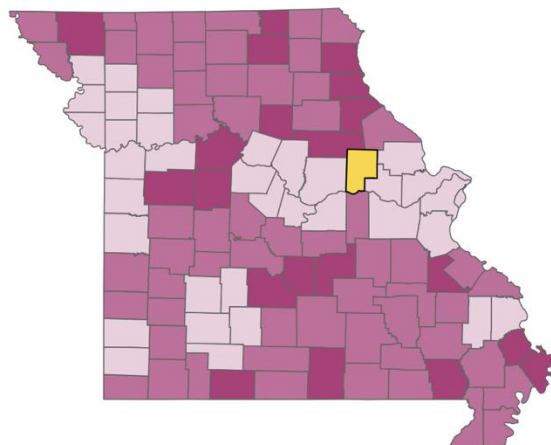

Leadership scores indicate how much trust community members have in their leaders. Low leadership scores indicate low trust, feelings of isolation, and a lack of leadership opportunities.

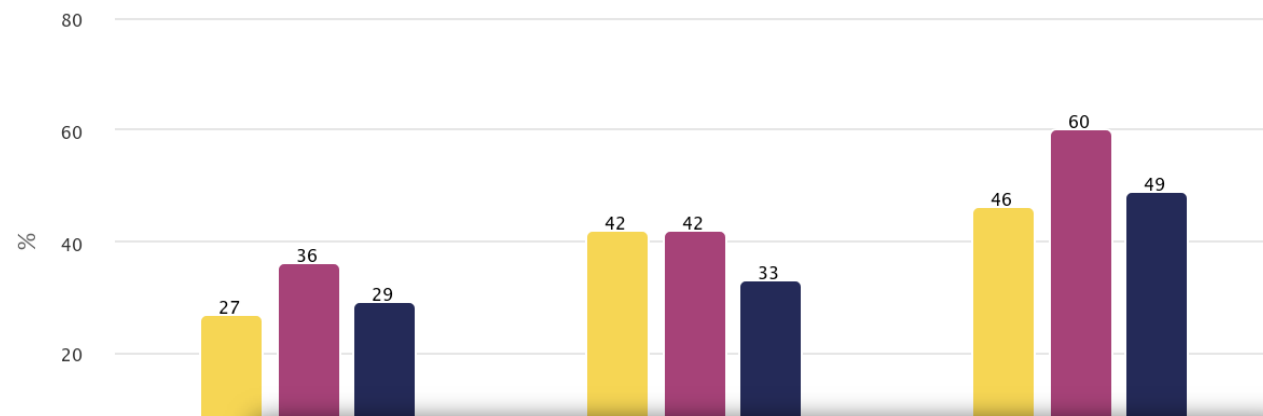

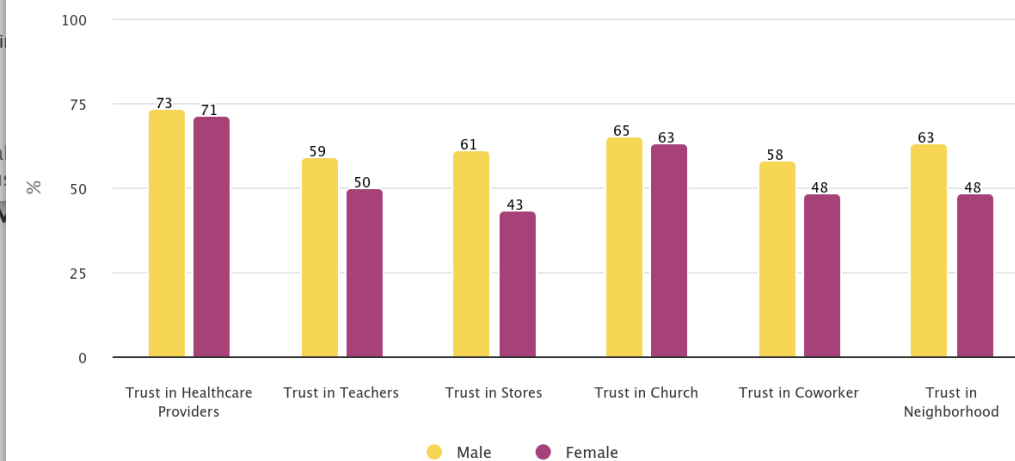

Trust in Community Members by Sex



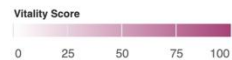
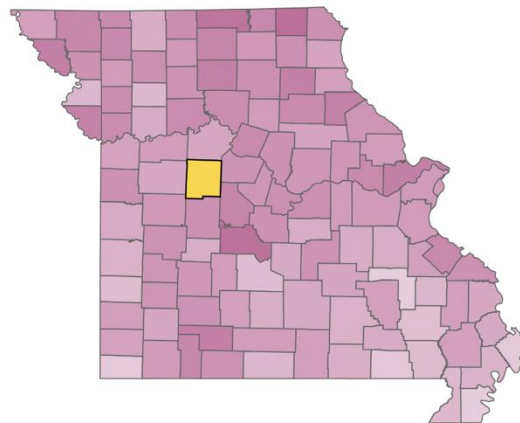

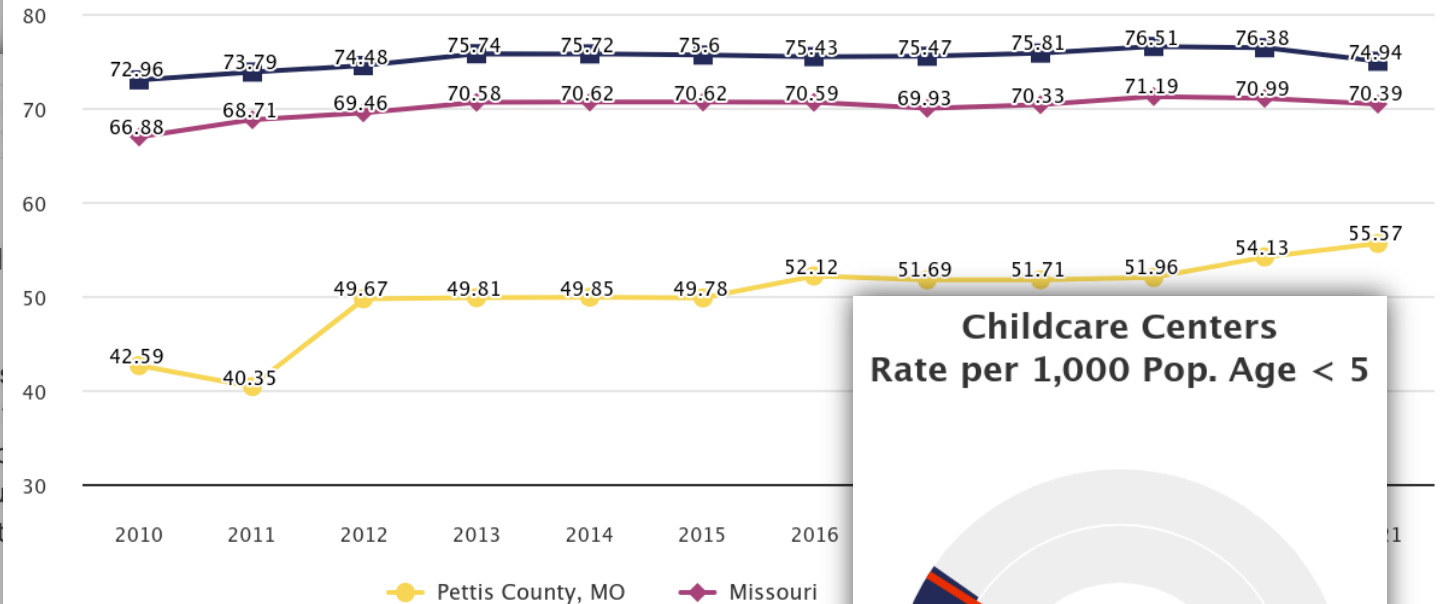

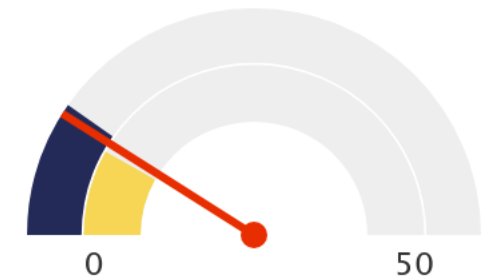
Access to Primary Care, Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by Year, 2010 through 2021

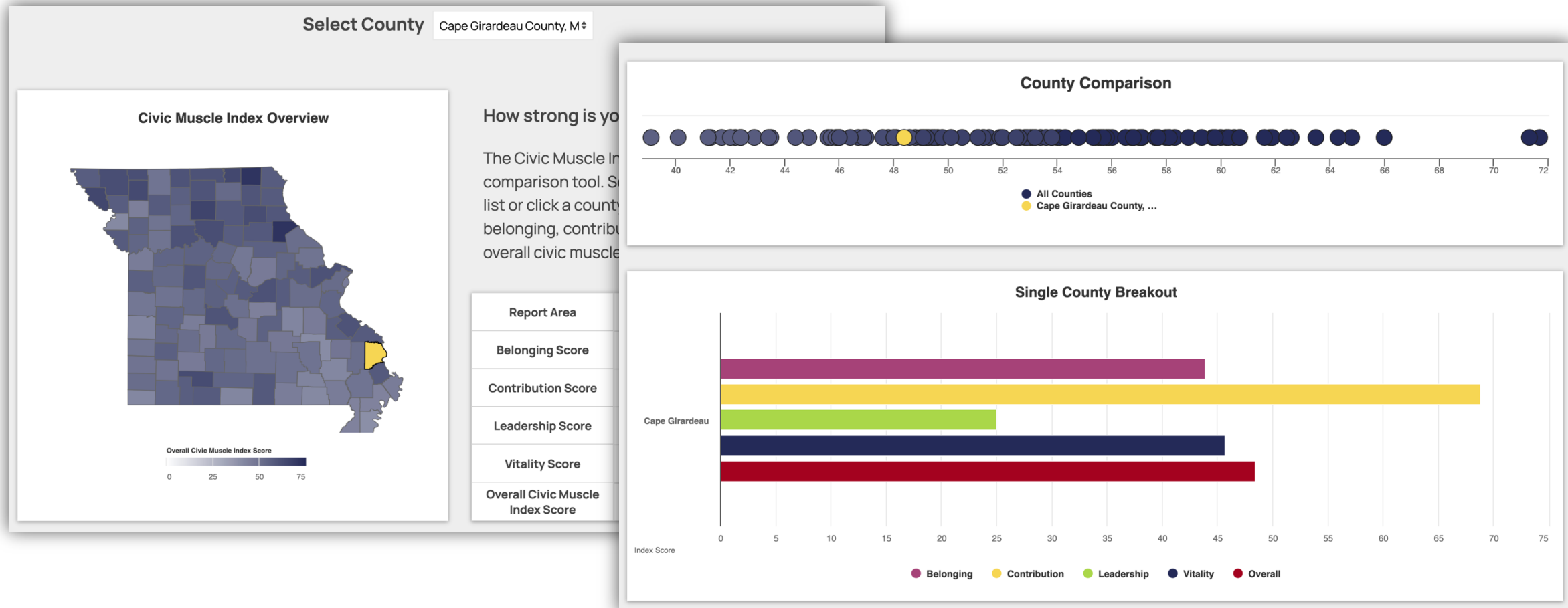

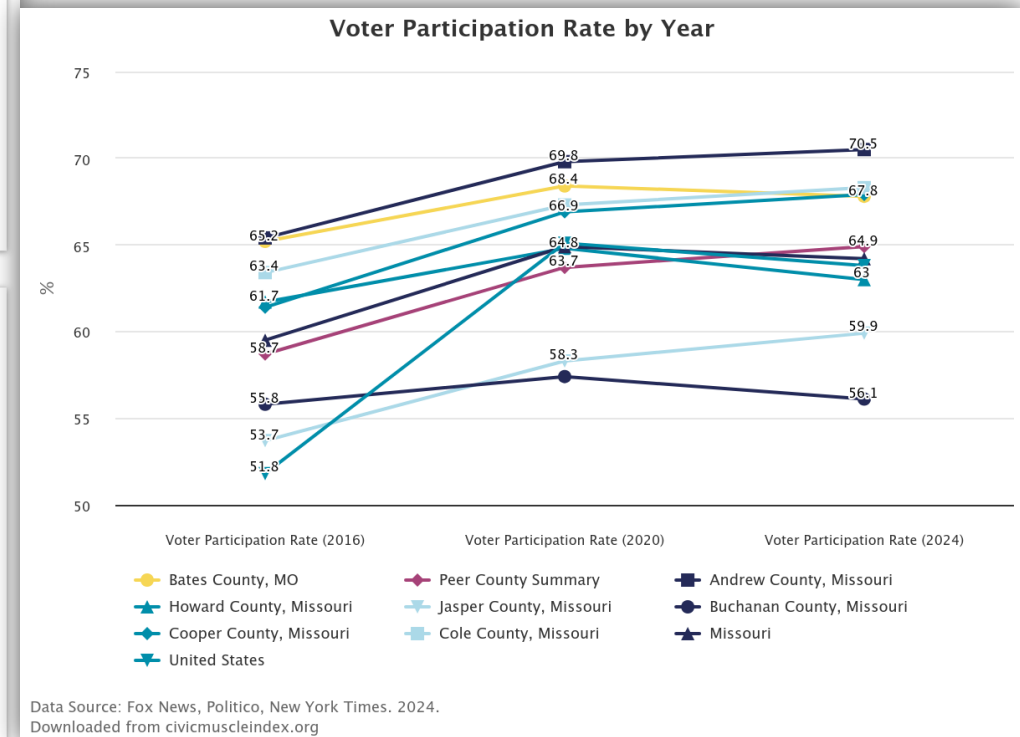
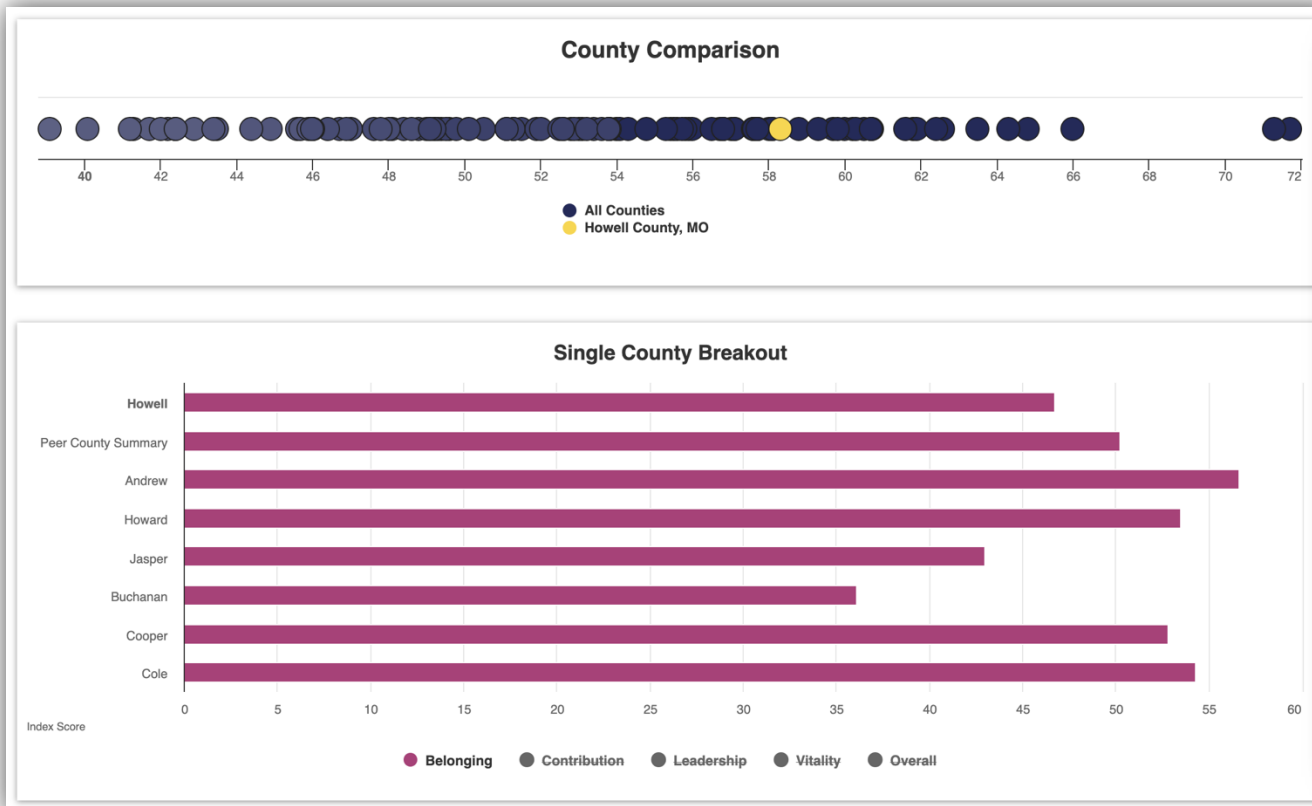
